AANR celebrates its 90th.

We often visualize the roots of the nudist movement as coming from the hippie culture of the late 60s and early 70s. The “Peace, Love, and Nature” movement certainly helped define nudism to a new generation of young people, but AANR was already approaching 40 years old at that time. I wondered what we might learn from looking at what was going on in this country in 1931, the year AANR was founded.

There was this thing called the “Great Depression”. Already well into its’ second year, and with unemployment doubling to 16.3 percent, Americans were beginning to realize this economic downturn might last a bit longer than they originally thought. It was not a great time to start a new venture, yet into this environment AANR was born as the “International Nudist League”. Birth of a new venture, in the midst of struggle and chaos is bold, but in this case, the boldness paid off.

Some other things happened in 1931. There was a tall building finished in New York City. In the midst of a growing economic catastrophe, people looked to the new “Empire State Building” as a monument to the idea that Americans could pull off some pretty incredible things. The ancient Hebrews called them “ebenezers” or “stones of help” something solid, immobile, often monumental, that reminds us of who we are and what we are about. Such things are important, especially in times of uncertainty and change. They are an anchor for the present and signify hope for the future.

Others failed in 1931, most notably, several automobile manufacturers. Companies that counted on the status quo to bring them an unending stream of new customers to buy their shiny wares. They were not positioned for changing circumstances and they were not flexible enough to adapt to the quickly changing times.

And finally, the city council in a tiny desert town in the middle of nowhere Nevada was taking bold actions. In spite of the national downturn, they saw a reason for hope. A new federal work project was happening nearby and they were already seeing the benefit of “new money” in the area. They put up their first traffic signal, to handle the increase in traffic from the dam workers coming into town, and they legalized gambling, to give the workers a reason to be there.

To be clear, I’m not suggesting we open the Tara Hall Casino and Bingo Parlour. But I am suggesting we look closely at the times in which we live, both on a national scale, and what is happening nearby.

In the middle of a worldwide pandemic, Austin is growing. This direction. We can’t change that. With that comes the inevitable rise in property value and taxes. We can beat them back for a time, but no matter what we do, these taxes will continue to rise.

We can choose how we deal with this reality. We can adopt a course of controlling expenses and dedicating a larger and larger percentage of our yearly revenue to county taxes, spending less and less on other, necessary things.

But Austin's growth doesn't have to be a negative. With it comes opportunity. More people means more potential nudists. We have the option is to grow our revenue fast enough to outpace the tax increases. We have plenty of "inventory". (Sites to build a cabin or locate an RV). We have plenty of interest. Every week we see a record influx of guests, many of them first timers not only to Star Ranch, but also to nudism in general. Capturing some of this market is, as I see it, our path to future sustainability.

90 years of AANR celebrates the work of those who have gone before us to build the organization to which we are affiliated. It also calls on us to do our best to build a sustainable Star Ranch. A place in the growing outskirts of Austin, where new people find a welcoming smile and where we make our homes.

Popular with members of our local deer population, some of Lynn's veggies have had short life spans, necessitating installing 6' tall chicken wire fencing. The wider-scope background photo features Goldenrod and Sunflowers, with Yellow Squash vines rambling around in the foreground. In the second photo, Bell Peppers (not pictured) are in the same bed as Marigolds, Grape Tomatoes (l.) and Cherry Tomatoes (r.). This less-than-100 sq. ft. space is covered with weed barrier, stepping stones and decorative gravel--- a thoroughly-landscaped garden in full sun. Sustainable produce and new decorative flora provide back-door access for human enjoyment, while discouraging some of our four-legged residents.


All Hands On Deck!



HEALTH AND SAFETY COMMITTEE

We are fast approaching our annual Texas late summer temperatures. It is wise to plan your day outside, and at the pool, before hand to stave off any problems.

- Pack up supplies you will need for the day (sunscreen, insect repellent, water, flashlight, snacks and medications you may need to take).
- Heat problems and dehydration can strike quickly so take steps to keep yourself hydrated (alcohol and soft drink consumption increases that risk).
- Keep your medical history in your purse or wallet with a list of any meds you are taking, in the event of an environmental emergency, so responders can react appropriately. There are apps that can be installed on your phone to keep it all as well.
- We have plenty of biting and stinging things about, so be careful of where you put your hands and feet and be sure to carry a flashlight if you plan to be out after dark. If you have a known allergy to an insect be sure to bring your epi-pen if prescribed.
- Be sure to let someone know if you are having a problem. If you plan to wander off on the property be sure to let someone know where, and when to expect you back if you don't take a buddy with you.



INTERNATIONAL SKINNY DIP DAY (ISDD)

Mark your calendar for one of the cheekiest summer events planned for 2021: International Skinny Dip Day. Skinny- dipping celebrates the natural joy of a carefree swim without cumbersome clothing. Lest you think otherwise, it's truly a wholesome tradition that's been enjoyed by such American patriots as Benjamin Franklin and John Quincy Adams, along with literary luminaries the likes of Henry David Thoreau and Walt Whitman.

To celebrate this rite of summer, last year the American Association for Nude Recreation officially designated the second Saturday in July as **International Skinny Dip Day (ISDD)**. For 2021, International Skinny Dip Day will be observed on **July 10th**.

ISDD serves as the culminating event during **National Nude Recreation Week (July 4-11, 2021)**, an AANR tradition for 44 years. This week-long celebration provides an opportunity for individuals and families to visit clothing-optional clubs affiliated with AANR or The Naturist Society (TNS), and experience firsthand one of the fastest growing trends in both travel and recreation – the **Nakation**□. Many clubs have activities and events planned throughout the week – such as open houses, dance parties, sports tournaments, chili cook-offs, “bare buns fun runs,” health screenings, art shows, and more.

On International Skinny Dip Day, in particular, the textile world is encouraged to join with naturists and free themselves of their clothes and inhibitions by taking a dip au naturel in their backyard pool, a secluded spot on a river or lake, at a sanctioned nude beach or at one of AANR's 180 clubs and resorts throughout the U.S., Canada and internationally.
